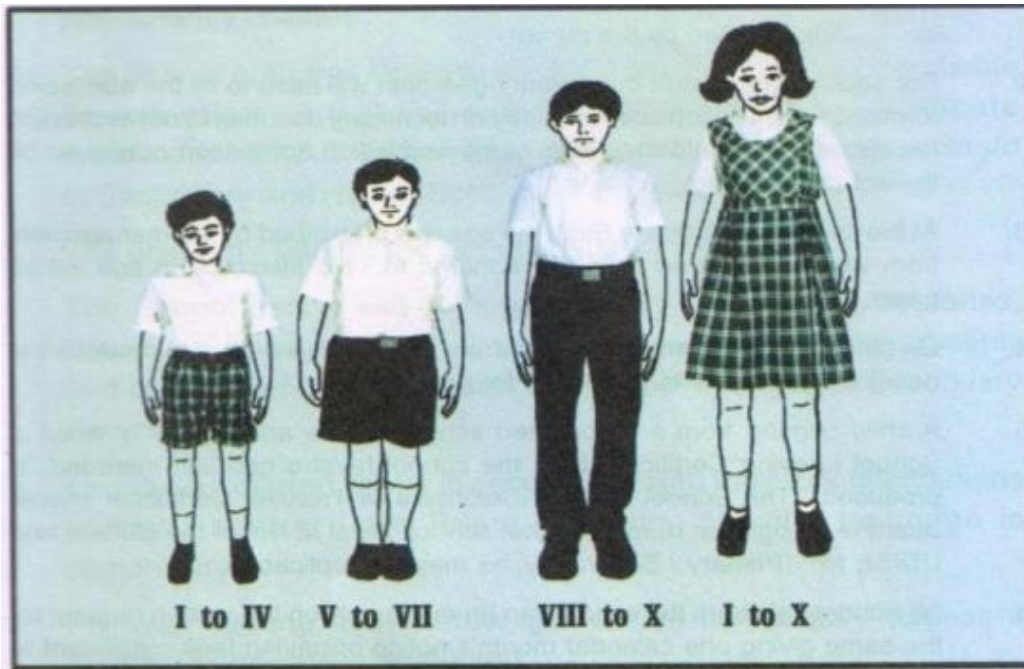

SCHOOL UNIFORM:**For Boys : Std I-IV**

Shirt: Cream yellow short-sleeved terrycot shirt.

Shorts: Half pants (Poly/Viscose) with Green check and with half back elastic

Socks: Plain White (Calf length).

Shoes: Black all season shoes with Velcro or laces.

For Boys : Std V-VII

Shirt: Cream yellow short-sleeved terrycot shirt.

Shorts: Plain Bottle Green half pants (Poly/Viscose)

Socks: Plain White (Calf length).

Shoes: Black all season shoes with laces.

For Boys : Std VIII-X

Shirt: Cream yellow short-sleeved terrycot shirt.

Pants: Plain Bottle Green full pants (Poly/Viscose)

Socks: Plain White (Calf length).

Shoes: Black all season shoes with laces.

Hair: Hair must not be longer than ear lobes at the sides and must be shorter than the top

edge of the shirt collar at the back and should not fall on the forehead. No fancy haircuts are allowed. Colouring of hair is not allowed.

For Girls

Blouse: Cream yellow short-sleeved 100% cotton blouse with shirt collar.

Pinafore: Green check (Poly/Viscose) with U-neck, sleeveless, box pleats in front and behind, and one side elastic on the waist (left side). The hem of the pinafore must not be higher than 2 inches above the kneecap.

Socks: Plain White (Calf length).

Shoes: Black all-season shoes with buckles.

Hair: If the girls' hair reaches their shoulders, they must make 2 plaits / ponytails using black ribbons as per the length of the hair. If the hair reaches just below the ears a black cotton hair band or black hair clips should be used to keep the hair in place. No fancy hairpins, clips or hair bands will be allowed.

Sweater: Plain bottle green 'V' necked pullover.

Nails: Nails should be clipped.

P.E. Uniform.

Black Track Pant – Sinker – 52% cotton + 48% polyester with House piping and drawstrings

Grey Mélange T- Shirt – 88% cotton + 22% polyester wrangler sleeves with round collar rib of the House colour and school logo on the chest

1. Wrangler sleeves – 100% cotton

2. Round rib – Cotton + Spandex

Socks – White nylon (Regular)

Shoes – Navy Blue canvas shoes with laces (Brand: Bata)

Sweater: Plain Bottle Green 'V-necked pullover

Girls must use black ribbons or black hair bands with P.E. uniform.

Wearing a clean and well-ironed uniform along with an identity card is compulsory for students.

We do not accept donations. Deposit money paid at the time of admission is refundable.

RULES REGARDING FEES

1. Term fees must be paid in June along with tuition fees for the first quarter and in December along with tuition fees for the third quarter. Fees may be paid on quarterly, half-yearly or yearly basis.
2. Fees for the month of March, April and May must be paid in March and this holds good even for those who wish to leave the school in April/May. The fees for the month of June must be paid by the 5th of June.
3. The delay of payment beyond 3 months renders a pupil liable to be struck off the roll. If the pupil is re-admitted the Admission Fee must be paid again.
4. **If a student is to be withdrawn, one calendar month's notice should be given in writing by the Parent/Guardian to the Principal of the school to arrange for the refund of the balance of tuition fees.** In exceptional circumstances of withdrawal, one month's tuition fee in lieu of one calendar month's notice will have to be paid. Amount collected as Term Fee or Tuition Fee will not be refunded.
5. Students whose fees are not paid will be considered as defaulters.
6. Unless all dues are paid by the student, the results of the examinations/ tests conducted by the school will not be communicated to the student. School Leaving Certificate will not be issued till all the outstanding dues from the student at the time of leaving the school are paid and clearance certificate from the concerned authority is obtained.
7. Students who leave the school in the month previous to any vacation must pay the fees for the vacation.
8. No deduction in fees will be allowed for vacations or for broken period of the month. Full month's fee will be payable if the student's name appears on the roll on the 1st day of the month. Admission fee will not be refunded even if the student, for any reason, leaves the school immediately after securing admission.
9. Students of Std. X will have to pay fees till May in the month of January.

PROCEDURE FOR CHEQUE PAYMENT:

Details to be entered on the cheque leaf are as follows:

- b) Write the correct date.

Day to day affairs of running the school are being managed by the Principal assisted by appropriate staff under overall supervision of the School Committee comprising 4 representatives of the Standing Committee and 3 members of the staff. The School Building is spacious with all modern facilities and is designed to accommodate students from Std. I to Std. X with a seating capacity of 3550 students; working in two shifts. The motto of the school reads “विद्या विनयेन शोभते” which means “MODESTY ADORNS KNOWLEDGE.”

The school does not receive any Grant-in-Aid from the Government and the only source of income is the amount of fees collected from the students.

The Trust holds exemption u/s 80G of the Income Tax Act and is registered with the Charity Commissioner under Registration No.E8297 (BOM) dated 17-8-1981 as a Public Charitable Trust with the object to establish and/or run educational institutions.

Any constructive suggestion from the parents whose children are being admitted to the school shall always be welcome. The Trust Office is housed in the Yashodham High School Building, Goregaon I, Mumbai – 400063, where such constructive suggestions can be recorded with the Trustee-incharge.

Parent-Teacher Association has been established on 02-08-2006 vide circular from School Education Department of Government of Maharashtra. Each parent shall be a member of the PTA.

SCHOOL INFORMATION

1. THANE POLICE SCHOOL is a permanently unaided school that was founded on 15-06-2006. The medium of instruction in the school is English. Presently, the classes are conducted for Primary (Std I to Std VII), Secondary (Std VIII to Std X).
2. The school prepares students of Class X for the Secondary School Certificate Examination (S.S.C.E.) conducted by the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education.
3. The academic year of the school begins in June.
4. The school has well-equipped Libraries, Science Laboratories, Auditorium, Computer Laboratories and Audio Visual rooms with latest equipment and offers Computer Education for both Primary & Secondary sections.
5. Languages offered will be in accordance with the recommendations of Maharashtra State Board. Learning Marathi is compulsory.
6. Physical training and outdoor games are compulsory (unless a doctor's certificate is produced).
7. Admissions of children to the school is open to all, irrespective of caste, creed, religion and sex.
8. The school admits children under Right to Free and Compulsory Education (RTE) Act 2009, Section 12(1)(c).
9. Should a Parent / Guardian feel that his / her child is not making the desired progress, the principal should be contacted for guidance. **OUR TEACHERS ARE NOT PERMITTED TO OFFER PRIVATE TUITIONS.** The Parents are advised to refrain from engaging teachers either from the school or from outside for coaching, as such tuitions normally do more harm than good.
10. The school premises is under CCTV surveillance.

GUIDANCE & COUNSELING CENTER

The school provides remedial education to the students. Guidance and counseling by a professional team of psychologists, counselors and remedial educators will be made available as and when required.

The facilities offered are:

- ❖ Child, parent and teacher counseling
- ❖ Psycho-educational assessment
- ❖ Aptitude Testing and Career guidance
- ❖ Remedial education for children having learning difficulties
- ❖ Special education services for children having Development lag/Delay/Disorder.
- ❖ Referral to other medical/Para- medical professionals if needed
- ❖ Prior appointments are necessary.
- ❖ Parents are advised to make good use of the facilities provided by the school.

RECOMMENDATION TO PARENTS

1. Since this is an English medium school. Every student should learn and write good English. Hence at home he/she should be given an opportunity to speak English Correctly. Parents should instruct their ward that except for Hindi/Marathi and Sanskrit classes, English alone should be spoken during the school hours.
2. Parents and Guardians are reminded that without their help and co-operation not much can be achieved by the efforts made by the school to mold and improve the character of the child. They are earnestly requested to instill discipline.
3. Parents are earnestly requested to pursue and sign the reports of the child or any other remarks made by the school authorities in the calendar and do the needful in the matter.
4. Parents should not engage school teachers as private tutors. Vide item 1 under school information.
5. Parents are requested to refrain from giving any gifts to any members of the staff.
6. Parents are requested to refrain from celebrating their children's birthday in the school in any way.
7. If any student is found to have done any damage to the school premises the parent/guardian will have to make good the loss. Decision of the Principal regarding the amount to be paid will be final.
8. Criticism of your children's teachers in the presence of children should be avoided as it encourages them to lose respect for their teachers. In case of any grievance, kindly meet the Principal.
9. Identity card for parents, guardians/servants must be carried to be permitted entry into the school premises. Parents are requested to refrain from entering the school premises except for meeting the Principal or teachers by appointment. Kindly advise servants who come to collect your wards from school, not to remain in the school premises any longer than is necessary.
10. Parents are advised to attend Open House as per the schedule given to them by the teachers on a timely basis.
11. If your child is suffering from infectious conditions like viral fever, conjunctivitis, acute cough and cold, chicken pox, etc., kindly refrain from sending him/her to school as it leads to spread of infection. All parents are advised to take this as a moral responsibility in preventing the spread of infection among students as well as staff and caregivers in school. Children suffering from any such infectious condition will not be allowed to attend school without producing a Fitness Certificate.

12. In case your child is suffering from any acute medical conditions such as: Asthma, Febrile Convulsions (Fits), Juvenile diabetes, Migraine, Depression / Psychological problems, etc., kindly keep the school authorities informed in writing about the following-
 - a. Telephone number of Parents
 - b. Person to be contacted in case of emergency
 - c. Medication / First Aid to be given
 - d. Telephone number of the Doctor
 - e. Brief medical history of the child.
13. Parents and guardians are requested to notify the school of any change in their address and telephone number,
14. There will be a penance study class for an hour for those who fail to do homework or for any other reason as informed by the teacher or the Principal.
15. Parents are informed that their children are liable to be sent home for any of the following reasons:
 - a. Arriving late for school
 - b. Not wearing proper uniform with Identity card
 - c. Not acknowledging the remark given by the school authorities by his/her parents/guardians.
 - d. Repeatedly forgetting to bring books, not submitting work on time.
 - e. Not acknowledging the receipt of the worksheet/circulars/report card.

BUS FACILITY

The school provides bus service to the students of all sections under the aegis of G.A.E.T.

INSTRUCTIONS:

- The bus facility is extended to students only when there is an availability of seats and is offered at the Principal's discretion. This offer can be withdrawn any time.
- Students will board and alight only at fixed bus stops. Parents and children are requested not to ask the driver or attendant to stop the bus at unauthorized bus stops.
- Parents are not permitted to change the bus stops, without prior permission.
- Children must obey and be courteous to the bus in-charge. Child found misbehaving in the bus will not be allowed to continue availing the bus facility.
- In the event of the child not being at the stop at the scheduled time the bus will proceed without the child. It will then be the responsibility of the parent/guardian to drop the child to school. In the event of there being no one to receive the child at the stop of the return journey, the child will be brought to the school and the parents will have to collect their child from the school authorities on presentation of their Identity Card.
- If a parent does not want his/her ward to avail the bus facility for some reason on a particular day, the school must be informed about it in writing.
- In case of any grievance, parents must inform the school authorities in writing for appropriate action. Parents must not enter / board the school bus for any reason.
- For any reason, if the parent drops his/ her child to school, parent must inform the Bus Department Supervisor and the Principal so that the child may avail drop facility, if required.

CONDUCT OF CHILDREN IN THE SCHOOL BUS

(Rules to be followed for a safe ride)

1. Children should not carry any electronic communication device/gadget in the school bus.
2. Students should be seated before the bus can move and fasten the seat belt. They should not stand until the bus comes to a complete halt.
3. It is mandatory for the children to wear the I-Card issued by the school everyday as parents will be able to track their ward only if the RFID card is punched.
4. They should be able to carry their belongings on and off the bus by themselves.
5. Reasonable silence must be maintained on the bus journey to ensure that the driver is not disturbed.
6. No bullying or dangerous behaviour will be tolerated. The offender will not be allowed to use the bus after one warning.
7. No part of the student's body or any object belonging to students should protrude from the bus window or door.
8. Children should not litter the bus. Cleanliness has to be maintained.
9. Any willful damage to the bus or equipment in the bus like fire extinguisher, CCTV Camera, etc. should be reported to the headmistress and the offender will be dealt with severely.
10. Children must obey and must be courteous to the bus-in-charge. Children found misbehaving in the bus will not be allowed to continue availing the bus facility.

IDENTITY CARD

- Children using the bus facility need to carry a Bus ID Card issued by the school.
- The school office must be notified, in case there is a change in residential address and a fresh ID Card must be obtained.
- If the Bus ID Card is lost, a written application requesting a duplicate must be submitted in the school office immediately. The duplicate may be collected from the school Office thereafter.

NOTE:

- An amount of Rs. 2500 is payable as admission fees (non-refundable) at the time of admission.
- Bus enrollment form should be filled and submitted along with each installment of the Bus fees.
- Medical History Form is printed at the end of the school calendar.
- No Bus child will be permitted to go home without submitting the permission letter.

BUS FEES

Bus fees may be paid by cheque or through paytm.

ADMISSIONS / WITHDRAWALS

1. Parents seeking admission for their ward in Std. I will have to produce any one of the following documents to confirm the date of birth.
 - a. Birth certificate given by hospital / municipality.
 - b. School leaving certificate from the Pre-Primary school.
 - c. Affidavit filed by the parent.
2. For seeking admission, the parent / guardian will have to fill the admission form online and attach a scanned copy of necessary documents not exceeding the size as per the format given in the admission notification published on the school website.
3. At the time of admission to Std. I, the age limit prescribed by the Management from time to time shall be rigidly adhered to. No relaxation in age will be given.
4. On being granted admission, the parent / guardian will have to produce the necessary documents in original for verification.
5. A child coming from a recognized school will be admitted only when a School Leaving Certificate from the school, he / she has last attended, is produced. The School Leaving Certificate or Transfer Certificate should bear the recognition number of that school, Saral Id No. of the student and UDISE No. (Primary / Secondary, as may be applicable).
6. All withdrawals from the school can be made only on the written request for the same, giving one calendar months' notice or paying fees equivalent to one month in lieu of the notice period by the parent / guardian of the child to the Principal. Application for a leaving certificate, should be made by the parent / guardian on the prescribed form provided in the school calendar. Signatures of both the parents are mandatory on the application form. Application for withdrawal at the end of the Academic Year should be submitted to the school office before 30th May. Those submitted after 30th May will invite a month's notice fee and for those submitted after the school has reopened will invite the payment of term fees along with a month's notice fee.
7. In case of request for a duplicate of the school leaving certificate, the parent / guardian, will have to produce an affidavit stating therein what has happened to the original certificate and why a duplicate School Leaving Certificate is needed. A nominal fee will be charged for obtaining a duplicate School Leaving Certificate.
8. In case of an adopted child, a certified copy of the adoption document is to be submitted at the time of admission.
9. In all matters regarding admission, the Principal's decision shall be final and binding on parents. Rules subject to change, pending implementation of Right to Education Act.

RULES REGARDING LEAVE, ABSENCE ETC.

- Regular attendance is essential.
- Students must be present in the school after holidays / vacations on the reopening day of the school. Absence without prior sanction renders the pupil liable to have his/her name stuck off the roll.
- A medical certificate will have to be produced immediately in case of absence due to sickness. A medical fitness certificate must be submitted by the student
- A student should not remain absent from the school except in case of emergency. The student must produce a note in his/her calendar from the parent/guardian stating the reason of absence.
- If the child is ill or suffering from any contagious disease, the principal must be informed about the same in two days and the child must not be sent to school till he/she is free from the danger of carrying infection.
- Unexplained absence of the pupil over a week makes him liable to have his/her name struck out from the roll. If he/she is re-admitted, the admission fees have to be paid again.
- No student will be permitted to leave the school early. No half day leave will be granted.
- Attendance and wearing P.E. Uniform at official functions like Sports Day, Independence Day, Republic Day etc. is compulsory. Absentees will be penalized.

RULES FOR THE STUDENTS

1. This is an English medium school. Students are expected to speak in English.
2. Students must bring the calendar everyday to school.
3. The school uniform and identity card must be worn everyday. A student without proper uniform will be sent back.
4. Uniform worn should be neat and tidy , hair properly combed and shoes polished well.
5. Students should not wear jewelry, smart watches, costly wrist watches and should not bring valuable items like mobile phones, iPods, tablets etc. to school. A fine of Rs.2000 will be levied on confiscation of such electronic gadgets.
6. Books, magazines, comics etc. should not be brought to school. No article liable to be a source of disturbance should be brought to school.
7. Any student coming late will not enter the class unless he/she brings a note to the teacher from Vice- Principal / Principal
8. Students must maintain silence in the school. They must maintain discipline when moving from one class to another.
9. No collections will be made by the students unless permitted by the principal in advance.
10. No student will be excused from Physical Education without a Doctor's Certificate.
11. Students are not allowed to give presents to the teachers.
12. Students are not allowed to distribute sweets/presents/ eatables of any kind on their birthday. Instead, they can voluntarily donate a book/s to the school library, to inculcate the good habit of reading and sharing.
13. Students should look after their books, clothes, pens, wrist watch, money, etc. School does not accept any responsibility for loss of such things.
14. Students should be regular, courteous, well-behaved, disciplined and clean in their dress and habits.
15. A student who is persistently insubordinate, willfully mischievous, guilty of misconduct and/or has unwholesome influence on fellow students is liable to be expelled from the school.
16. A student is responsible to the school not only for his/her behavior in the school but also for his/her general behaviour outside. Every effort should be made by the student to keep up the good name of the school by his/her manners and deportment. Students should greet their teachers / visitors when they meet them.
17. Students will not take part in any political activities.
18. During the absence of the teacher, the Prefect or Monitor will be responsible for the order and discipline of the class.
19. Students are forbidden to buy eatables from street vendors.
20. Students are expected to keep THE SCHOOL PREMISES CLEAN.
21. Stickers, Posters, Tattoos & Mobile Phones are not permissible inside school premises.

SAFETY MEASURE

1. Students should compulsorily wear the identity-card issued to them by the school along with their uniform.
2. Parents should inform the school the school authority regarding the particulars of the person they delegate to collect their children from school, if they are not doing so themselves.
3. Identity card provided by the school must be carried by the parents / guardians.
4. Children should be given the following instructions; periodically & children should be alert at all the times.
 - Children should not talk to strangers, accept anything in cash or kind from strangers.
 - Children should never agree to go with strangers.
 - Children should not agree to go home even with relatives without prior confirmation with their parents.
 - Children should not talk loudly on the street or in front of strangers about the situation of their home or about the time when their parents are not at home.
 - Children should always move around in groups, especially to and fro from school.
5. It is imperative for parents to collect their children from the point at which they are left by the school bus otherwise the children will be brought back to school.
6. Parents Should explain the concept of good touch and bad touch to their children.
7. Children using the school bus will be given numbers, so that they sit in the proper place.
8. Parents can form carpool groups for leaving and bringing children to and fro from school.
9. Parents should supervise/stay with the children when they go down play.
10. Sending children to shops/ shopping centre alone should be avoided.
11. Parents should give their children a Re. 1/- coin so that children can call home from the nearest P. C. O. in case of emergency.
12. Parents should ensure that the phone numbers on the i-card are correct.
13. Parents are advised not to send if they are unwell.
14. Along with the values learnt in school, it is of utmost importance to lay stress on cleanliness & hygiene, above all a sense of responsibility.

INTERNET / CYBER SAFETY

Internet is an amazing source of information, is a way to stay connected with friends and family. However, it has a flipside and comes with its share of problems. Internet safety is about children being smart about how to handle themselves online and protecting themselves from falling prey to any online scam.

STRATEGIES AT STUDENT LEVEL

Students should be encouraged to :

- ❖ take responsibility for managing their digital reputation.
- ❖ trust each other respectfully online and offline.
- ❖ understand the importance of protecting their password.
- ❖ think about where they are travelling to and whether it is a safe place to spend their online time.
- ❖ be aware that people can pretend to be anybody they want online, so it is best to have only offline friends.
- ❖ share their experience of cyber bullying with adults.

STRATEGIES AT THE PARENT / FAMILY LEVEL

- ❖ Place computers in a central location at home.
- ❖ Be active in their child's life and should know who their friends are, both online and offline.
- ❖ Look out for signs of bullying such as
 - a. Loss of interest in school.
 - b. Not wanting to spend time with friends.
 - c. Anxiety around technology uses.
 - d. Being depressed.
 - e. Difficulty in sleeping.
 - f. Lower school performance.
- ❖ Keep evidence of cyber bullying.
- ❖ Set up an alert on Google.
- ❖ Educate their child not to leave her / his mobile phone lying around where others can use it, without permission.

IMPORTANT NOTE

1. Display of any disorderly conduct, doing any act which causes or likely to cause physical / or psychological harm, raise apprehension or fear or shame or embarrassment to a student in or outside the school, which includes abusing, threatening, or playing practical jokes or leaving and causing hurt to any student is strictly prohibited.
2. Asking any student to do or forcing him to do something which a student will not in the ordinary course willingly do, is also a punishable offence.
3. Any such disorderly act found by the Institution, will be subject to an enquiry by a committee constituted by the school.
4. If students involved are found to be at fault, the same will be reported to the competent authorities for necessary action.
5. In addition, such students are liable to be dismissed from the school. They may not be able to get admitted in any Educational Institution for a period of five years.

RULES FOR SCHOOL LIBRARY

1. The library is open from 9:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. on school days.
2. Pupils will be given library cards for borrowing books and each pupil is responsible for the books taken on his/her card.
3. Books will be issued for the use of the borrower only.
4. A pupil can borrow or return books once a week only.
5. Books should not be kept for more than a week. At the end of each period, books may, if desired, be renewed at the discretion of the Librarian. However, the book must be produced for such a renewal.
6. For failure to return a book on the expiry of the period of week, the pupil will be penalized Rs.5 per day.
7. Books must be kept clean and used carefully. No marking should be done in the library book. Any imperfection found in them or any damage done to them must be reported to the School Librarian before taking the book home. The damage done to books or magazines and loss of books will have to be made good by the pupil concerned.
8. Reference books and magazines cannot be borrowed or taken out of the library.
9. All books must be returned in good condition before the beginning of each Terminal Examination and before a Leaving Certificate is issued. The borrower who fails to return a book must pay a fine equal to the value of the book.
10. Bags, cases and eatables must not be taken into the library.
11. Every pupil should help to keep the library clean and tidy and see that the books and magazines are kept in their proper places.
12. Strict silence must be observed in the library and conversation if essential, should be kept to the minimum and voice should be low.
13. The library should be used only for perusing reference books, parallel text books, periodicals and reviews.
14. Before taking the School Leaving Certificate, every student is requested to return all Library books and get the Librarian's signature on the Clearance Certificate and the Form of Application for School Leaving Certificate. The necessary forms are provided at the end of the calendar.
15. Library will be closed on Public and National holidays.

LABORATORIES

Facilities to use all the laboratories are available to students for Std. III upwards. All experiments will be undertaken in the presence of and with the knowledge of the teacher and the Laboratory Assistant.

Pupils are requested to take special care of the Laboratory materials and apparatus. The cost of repairs and replacements, if any, will be borne by the pupils concerned. No pupil is allowed into the Laboratory except during Practical Periods.

IN - HOUSE SPORTS COACHING

At G.A.E.T, sports are given a place of prominence in conjunction with other co-curricular activities. We believe that a healthy mind resides in a healthy body and therefore encourage each and every child to participate in sports. Coaching facilities for Handball, Throw ball, Basketball and Football are extended to all the students during school hours. Students learn different skills required to play these games and participation helps them to increase their strength and stamina.
